How to find us?

1. You can reach our venue in the very centre of Warsaw by using buses number 102, 105, 111, 116, 128, 175, 178, 180, 222, 503 or E-2. Look for the bus stop named “Uniwersytet”.
2. Alternatively, you can use Warsaw metro line 2, also looking out for “Uniwersytet” station.
3. The campus is easily approached from Warsaw Central Railway Station (“Warszawa Centralna” or “Dworzec centralny”) by using the buses number 128 or 175.
4. Use the buses no 175 (“Warszawa Centralna” bus stop) or 188 (“Metro Politechnika” bus stop) to arrive at the city centre from Warsaw Chopin Airport.
